Acts 10 – WE recommend reading the entire chapter before meeting with your Life Groups.

Ask:

1. Do you find that you have preconceived ideas about certain people or groups of people? How did you come about these ideas/opinions?
2. In his sermon, Craig told a story about how an 11-year-old Benjamin taught the restaurant manager how to pour a perfect Guinness. Tell us about a time when you learned something from someone that seemed to be an unlikely teacher.
3. *“You can learn something from anybody about anything at anytime. You just have to be humble and hungry—a learner and a listener.”* Are you more of a listener or learner? Why do you say that? What can you do to become better at both?

4. Each of us are created by God, in the image of God. He loves us equally. He does not play favorites. Often, we let others criticisms of us cloud what is true (see above). How have you experienced this?
5. Have you ever “played favorites?” What led you to do this? Looking back, how did doing this effect your relationship with others? What effect did doing so have on you? Now, flip the switch. Has there been a time when you felt someone was being shown favoritism over you? What was the circumstance? How did this effect you?
6. Peter dealt with those who criticized him with grace and truth. Why do you think this is important? How can we better react with grace and truth?
7. Craig mentioned that Peter let people “come to their own conclusions” when it came to critics. In doing so, he showed self-control. Why do you think this took self-control? Is it something you see yourself good at doing? How can you better practice self-control in these situations?
8. Our primary job in life is to point others to God. Spend some time with your group talking about what this looks like in each of your lives. What are you doing to point others to God? What have others done to point you to God? What are some things you can do as a group to continually point others (including those in your group) to God?
