Letter from Craig

Paul is in jail. He is writing a letter to the church he planted in Ephesus a few years earlier. In the middle of the letter, Paul begins praying for them. One of the things Paul prays is: Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine. -Ephesians 3:20 (NIV)

Paul has experienced *immeasurably more*. The forgiveness of sins. Deep community with other believers. The birth of dozens of churches. People being healed right in front of him. Times he experienced healing. Moments he felt so close to God. Purpose and passion for life. Paul experienced *immeasurably more*, and he wanted this for the Ephesians.

Paul was the right person, in the right place, at the right time. His entire ministry was and continues to be *immeasurably more*. He walked and sailed thousands of miles to serve people who needed Jesus. The world still needs Jesus. The Water's Edge is the right church, in the right place, at the right time for many people in the western parts of Omaha and beyond. I believe our congregation's response in 2024 will be like Paul's response throughout his ministry: one of commitment and obedience.

I remember walking the church's property with Benjamin late one night in the summer of 2011. Twelve years later, I look back and am grateful for so much *immeasurably more*. I don't even know where to begin. From adopting and serving the Miller Park neighborhood in North Omaha to providing water to countless people in Nicaragua. From all the friendships that have been created to the relationships that have been healed. From the children and students who have been mentored and loved to the new people who have been welcomed and are now family. It's all *immeasurably more* than I could have ever asked or imagined.

The Water's Edge is a hopeful place, and I'm a hopeful person. I believe so many more *immeasurably more* moments will happen in 2024, and I believe our best *immeasurably more* moments are still in front of us.

I'm grateful for your generosity that has made *immeasurably more* happen and allows The Water's Edge to remain in a robust financial position, setting us up for much more *immeasurably more* in the future. Our giving to ministry and missions is up 14.2% over last year, and our mission giving is up an astounding 26.9% over last year. Immeasurably more, for sure.

The Water's Edge is known citywide as a generous church. The blessing is twofold. Hope and help for the recipients and fulfillment and joy for the giver. Generosity frees us from the chains of materialism and consumerism, restores us to God's image, and allows us to partner with God and others in serving and loving the world.

I encourage you to read this brochure's pages and celebrate The Water's Edge's impact on the lives of so many. Also, take a look at the financial information and the giving challenge. And, join me in praying about deepening our financial commitment to The Water's Edge and God's Kingdom in 2024 so that WE and others can experience *immeasurably more*.

Ola Otto

Ola hit rock bottom with the loss of her husband, Roger, in April 2021 during the midst of the pandemic. Ola and her daughter, Kim, collected Ola's possessions and moved her back to Omaha so they could be near each other. Ola began searching for a church. Kim mentioned The Water's Edge

after attending a memorial service here for a friend. The first online service Ola attended was in May 2022, the Sunday after our long-time worship leader, AJ Sandoval, passed away. Pastor Craig shared a passionate and personal message on grief and pain—exactly what Ola needed as she continued working through the grief associated with Roger's loss.

In October, feeling a call to dig deeper, Ola reached out to Pastor Leandra after hearing about WE University and Disciple Bible Study. During her grief and the challenges of the pandemic, Ola stepped out in faith and signed up! Ola fondly recalls meeting and connecting with "authentic people" who accepted her with open arms, love, and grace. Everyone welcomed her and made her feel like she was at home. Over the next 12 weeks, Ola described challenging but rewarding assignments, rich conversations, and a new focus in her faith journey. As that course ended, Ola signed up for the New Testament course and started attending in person.

Ola is extremely thankful that she was asked to serve at The Water's Edge. She quickly connected with Pastor Jason and began volunteering with WE Kids. Next, she jumped in with both feet - helping host our Sunday services online. Most recently, Ola joined the team that teaches Disciple Bible Study. She is grateful for The Water's Edge and how the church is helping her heal and grow. In a little over a year, her faith, confidence, and hope have grown immeasurably more than she imagined in those dark times.

WE Kids

- 120+ volunteers pouring faith into our kids monthly
- Averaging **116 kids** birth to fifth grade each Sunday
- 375 VBS participants with 196 volunteers (largest yet!)
- 84 kids joined Hooked for Life fishing and faith ministry

WE Youth

- Over 30 adults invest in WE Youth weekly
- An average of **100 students** regularly attend each week
- 28 students celebrated their confirmation of faith
- **89 students** and leaders participated in summer mission trips to Michigan and Wisconsin
- 200 middle school students attended our first fall
 5th Quarter event in partnership with Journey Church and Gretna Campus Life (Youth for Christ)

Adults

- WE have welcomed 131 new members so far this year
- Over **360 people** are in **28 house churches**—connecting with each other and growing in their relationship with Jesus
- 25 women gather for *Mothers of Preschoolers* (*MOPS*) to live motherhood life together

Missions

- WE sent a total of 35 missionaries to Belize,
 Nicaragua, and Uganda this year
- Investing \$30,000 and 8 WE Serve days with **Abide**Omaha in the **Miller Park** neighborhood
- Your **\$34,000** in donations provided food and Christmas presents for families in partnership with **Project Wee Care**
- WE partnered with Sleep in Heavenly Peace donating \$62,000 to purchase 248 beds for kids who don't have one
- WE gave **\$120,000** to **Amigos for Christ** which provided running water for **75 families**



Recurring giving is an automated plan for regular giving each month. Recurring giving allows you to give your tithes and offerings to God first. It also provides the church with a predictable income stream.

Electronic Funds Transfer

To establish an electronic funds transfer, complete the Estimate of Giving Card authorizing the EFT and attach a voided check for the account you will use. You can choose to have the withdrawal once or twice a month. EFT giving is simple and convenient. To change the amount on your current EFT, indicate the change on your Estimate of Giving Card. Or you can contact jennie@weomaha.com. She is happy to serve you.

Recurring Online Giving

Online Giving is a convenient, secure online system that makes giving easy! Setting up Online Giving is a quick, one-time process. You will be asked to link a credit or debit card to your account. You get to determine how often and when you give. Visit <a href="weenmanth-ween

Recurring Bill Pay

Bill Pay is another way to plan to schedule your giving. All major banks offer this service. You tell them when and how much to send, and they mail us a check. For those aged 70 ½ and older, making tax-favorable charitable gifts from IRA accounts is possible. This is known as a **Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD).** A total of up to \$100,000 per year can be transferred directly from IRAs to a qualified charity, such as our church, free from federal income tax. There may also be state income tax savings.

Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) are the minimum amounts you must withdraw from your retirement accounts each year. You generally must start taking withdrawals from your traditional IRA, SEP IRA, SIMPLE IRA, and retirement plan accounts when you reach age 72.

A QCD can help meet your RMD requirement. By giving all or part of your RMD, you can practice generosity and benefit from substantial tax savings. Many of our donors in this age group are giving from their RMD.

To donate from an IRA, it is important to donate directly from the IRA to the church. Contact your tax professional or financial planner if you have questions.



Appreciated Stock

WE accept stocks and other securities. Like the RMDs noted above, many have found tax savings through this giving option—contact jennie@weomha.com for information on transferring stock to the church.


